



#### **Success Stories**

#### CBR-Seed Loan (Micro Credit Scheme)



My name is Bhagwati Kanojia, I am 100% Speech & Hearing Impaired. I am 20 years old and live in Nawada, Uttam Nagar, New Delhi. There are 6 members in my family. My family is financially very weak. I was studying and working as well as running a small shop in the evening after attending school. I was worried because customers returned but there was insufficient material in my shop. One day I met a rehabilitation worker of ASRA and she informed me about activities of ASRA and facilities provided by ASRA for persons with disabilities. I was very happy to hear, because I found a solution to my problems. I told to ASRA staff that I need a small loan for expanding my petty shop. I applied for a seed loan and got approval during a meeting

organised by ASRA staff members. Now, my shop is full of material. I also got hearing aid and disability pension with the help of ASRA. I am learning computer from ASRA Computer Centre. I am very happy and feel confident. My heartfelt thanks to ASRA. **– Bhagwati Kanojia** 

My name is Mohammed Shamim. I have locomotor disability. I am 28 years old and live in Bawana slum community. My father's name is Abdul Kalam. My mother's name is Rupeda Khatoon. There are 9 members in my family. Before joining ASRA, I was very upset. I was not aware of any type of government facilities. I wanted to open a grocery shop. One day, I met Ms. Mithilesh ma'am (ASRA Employee) in Bawana slum community. She gave me full information about ASRA's activities. Ms. Mithilesh Ma'am introduced me to all the schemes and programs provided by the Government. ASRA also helped me in getting



government facilities such as a disability certificate, bus pass, rail pass and disability pension. I required tricycle for my daily work routine. I approached ASRA for that and I received tricycle within one month. I wanted to open a small shop. I didn't have sufficient money for that. Then I approached ASRA for a seed loan (Micro Credit Scheme). I got material for my shop worth Rs. 5000/- from ASRA. I am very thankful to ASRA for providing me the financial help which has increased my family's income. I am very very thankful to ASRA. — **Mohammed Shamim**

 During the quarter under report, Required & Delivered (R&D) status of Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) was updated in ASRA's adopted slum communities along with identification of new PwDs and awareness of ASRA's CBR programs.

#### d. CBR: Education Program



 A new Education Centre has been opened in ASRA's adopted slum community namely, 'Majnu Ka Tila' during the quarter under report.

Newly opened Education Centre in 'Majnu Ka Tila' slum community

ASRA is running Inclusive Education Centres which are providing nursery classes for children between the ages of 3 to 6 years, Non-Formal Education (NFE) for out-of-school children who have left their education for unavoidable reasons. These children are mainstreamed in formal schools by ASRA. Remedial Education (REC) is provided to school going children to prevent them to dropout from school. ASRA is also running Special Education classes for children with special needs-intellectually challenged children.







#### e. CBR: Sponsorship Program

It is seen that disabled children in slums are seldom respected, admired or accepted. ASRA took an initiative to promote the education of Children with Disabilities at their post primary level. The target children are selected from ASRA's adopted slum communities. Counseling of parents is done regularly. This is an ongoing successful project since August 2010.







Total **207** Children with Disabilities (CwDs) have been **sponsored** under this program. They also received physiotherapy, occupational therapy, special education, non-formal education, remedial education etc.

During the Quarter under report, **71 Children with Disabilities** were provided sponsorships covering their tuition fee, uniform, stationery, transport charges, paramedical services etc. on a monthly basis.
