

Success Stories

CBR-Referral Services and Medical Intervention



I am Neetu, mother of Master Lavansh who is 9 years old. Lavansh is my only child and he is mentally and physically challenged. We live in Nanhe Park slum community and my husband works as a labour. As my son is physically and mentally challenged, I was really concerned about my son. Our financial condition is not good to secure the future of my son. My husband takes responsibility of our family including my father-in-law, mother-in-law and sister-in-law. Due to our financial condition, I have to think a lot about my son for his education and medical expenses. One day two staff members of ASRA came to my home namely, Mrs. Pooja (Education Teacher) and Mrs. Deepali Mam (Supervisor-Education Program). They explained me all about ASRA's activities and counseled me about how ASRA's activities can help me more to develop future and to take care of my son. As per their guidance, I submitted all the required documents of my son to ASRA. They helped me in availing Disability Certificate, Rail Pass, Bus Pass and Disability Pension of my son, which helped me a lot. ASRA's Physiotherapist also comes to my

home regularly to give therapy to my son. ASRA helped me a lot. They have provided a Wheelchair and caliper to my son. Now he can walk by own, which makes his life easier. My special thanks to ASRA and whole team of ASRA, who helped me a lot to take care of my son. Now I am less tensed. I can easily meet his medical expenses by his monthly pension. Again I am very thankful to ASRA from my bottom of heart. ASRA has also helped many children, who suffered disability and faced problems like me and my son. — Ms. Neetu, Mother of Lavansh

Seed Loan (Micro Credit Scheme)

My name is Vijay Gupta. I am physically handicapped with my both lower limb. I am 27 years old and live in Mohan Garden, Uttam Nagar, New Delhi. There are 6 members in my family. I belong to lower-middle class family. I wanted to be self-independent. I wanted to take up a job so as to become independent and self-reliant financially. It was then that someone in my neighbour informed me about ASRA and its facilities provided to disabled person I met Mr. Sanjay Sir (Rehab Worker of ASRA) in Uttam Nagar. He gave me full information about the ASRA organisation. I told him about my requirement of Wheel Chair for my daily routine. I received Wheel Chair from ASRA. I wanted to open a small mobile accessories shop. I did not have sufficient amount to start the shop. Then once again,



I approached ASRA for Seed Loan (Micro Credit Scheme). I got material for my shop worth Rs.5000/- from ASRA. I am very thankful to ASRA for providing me the financial help which has increased my family's income. I am thankful to ASRA from the depth of my heart.

UPDATE ON ONGOING PROGRAMS

COMMUNITY BASED REHABILITATION (CBR)

Implementation of 'Promoting and Enhancing Advocacy and Awareness level about Rehabilitation Services for Persons with Disabilities living in Delhi slums and Resettlement Colonies through 30 or more Community Meetings, Counselling Sessions, Workshops and Rallies.'

(With support from Embassy of Switzerland through AFS initiated w.e.f. 20th May, 2019 till 31st October, 2019)

Following is an Update on this New Initiative from 20th May 2019 to 30th August 2019:

Awareness creation regarding 'Benefits and Concessions under Government Schemes and Services provided for Persons with Disabilities': Meetings were organized in ASRA's 15 adopted slum communities.

During the meetings, various issues such as importance of early detection of disabilities, medical intervention and advantages of therapeutic services, educational rehabilitation, vocational rehabilitation and self-reliance leading towards mainstreaming and inclusion of persons with disabilities in the society were discussed. The meetings were conducted by ASRA CBR Team consisting of Coordinators, Therapists, Social Workers, Rehabilitation Workers, and Prosthetic & Orthotic Engineer etc. and were attended by various stakeholders such as persons with disabilities, their family members and other people living in the slum communities.

Children between the age of 3 and 6 years
are provided Nursery Education. NonFormal Education (NFE) is provided to outof-school children who have left their
education for unavoidable reasons. These
children are mainstreamed in formal
schools by ASRA. Remedial education (REC)
is provided to school going children to
prevent them to dropout from school. ASRA
is also running Special Education classes for
children with special needs-intellectually
challenged children.






CBR: Sponsorship Program

This program is exclusively for children with disabilities.

It is seen that disabled children in slums are seldom respected, admired and accepted. ASRA took an initiative to promote the education of Children with Disabilities at their post primary level. The target children are selected from ASRA's adopted slum communities. Counseling of parents is regularly done. This is an ongoing successful project running since August 2010.







Total **207** Children with Disabilities (CwDs) have been **sponsored** under this program till date. They also received physiotherapy, occupational therapy, special education, non-formal education, remedial education etc.

f. CBR: Vocational Training:

ASRA is running Inclusive Vocational Training / Skill Development Centres in Tailoring, Beauty Culture, Computer Courses and Mobile Repairing Courses in adopted slum communities. The training has empowered girls/ women and young boys to earn their livelihood. Those who have completed their vocational training course are now able to supplement their family income by taking jobs and order work from their community members.
