CONTINUING OUR MISSION DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC AND A NATIONWIDE LOCKDOWN

In view of the COVID-19 Pandemic, a nationwide lockdown was announced by the Government of India w.e.f. 25th March 2020. While COVID-19 is impacting the entire population, Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) are more vulnerable to the disease due to their physical, sensory and cognitive limitations.

During the period under report, there were restrictions without lockdown, hence, ASRA Head Office and its services resumed its functioning six days per week. From 7th October 2021 onwards, the vocational training students started attending the classes regularly in the ARTC. The Medical department also started operating and patients started coming for therapies in occupational therapy, physiotherapy and speech Therapy Departments.

In AIRTC, children with special needs also resumed their sessions in limited numbers. One to one session of Special Education were conducted in the AIRTC w.e.f. 26th October 2021. Five children with special needs enrolled in AIRTC were provided with five special kits to take care of their education, nutrition, personal hygiene, therapeutic needs along with essential food items and ration.

In CBR, the therapy sessions continued and referral, counselling and awareness creation programs on disability related issues as well as pandemic related issues. During the quarter under report, 46 PwDs from the communities were vaccinated under the Vaccination drive program undertaken by ASRA. However, towards the end of 2021, the Pandemic was proving to be a hindrance to efficiently conducting education, trainings and treatment facilities in CBR. This was particularly true for children, who were all unvaccinated. After a comprehensive review, it was concluded that online classes were not efficient or productive enough. Infact, there were complaints received from some parents as well about the quality of education. Same was found to be true about CBR vocational and treatment programs. As a result it was decided that the CBR activities will be temporarily discontinued and operations will be streamlined towards ARTC until normalcy returns. During the period under report two helpers and five teachers of CBR Beauty Culture unit had to be let go.

On-ground, 60 children under the CBR program were provided with study material and essential items and essentials have been distributed to 217 Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) on a need-based feedback.

AWARENESS GENERATION AND DISTRIBUTION OF ESSENTIAL ITEMS TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES OF ADOPTED SLUM COMMUNITIES DURING COVID-19 CRISIS

During the first wave of COVID-19 pandemic, 2493 PwD beneficiaries across **68 communities** have been provided with essential items / relief packages from June 2020 to March 2021. As the COVID cases had risen due to second and much stronger wave of COVID 19, lockdown was again imposed in Delhi w.e.f. 17thApril 2021 to 15th July 2021 (Partially Open). ASRA once again contacted its beneficiaries to do needs assessment survey and to know their primary needs. Several beneficiaries were struggling for food and to meet their basic daily necessities. It was decided to once again provide essential items / relief packages to the most needy PwD beneficiaries. During the quarter under report, **217 PwDs from 5 communities** were provided with essential items / relief package to meet their daily needs.

DISTRIBUTION OF EDUCATION, NUTRITIOUS FOOD / IMMUNITY BOOSTER, PERSONAL HYGIENE, THERAPEUTIC KITS AND ESSENTIAL FOOD KIT TO THE CHILDREN UNDER EDUCATION, SPONSORSHIP AND AIRTC PROGRAMS

During the first wave of COVID-19 pandemic, total 924 children were provided with study material such as notebooks, registers, pencils, pens, erasers, drawing books, colours and 'Nutritious Food' / Immunity Boosters like porridge and dry flakes from June 2020 to March 2021.

An outcome of the CBR survey conducted during the quarter suggested that the children under the Education Program of ASRA needed to be kept engaged meaningfully on daily basis. Their health, hygiene and therapeutic needs were also important and had to be addressed.

Accordingly doorsteps distribution of 'Education Kits' and 'Nutritious Food' was initiated based on the teachers' feedback which was duly verified by the Rehab / Social workers and CBR Coordinators. During the quarter under report, 60 children of Education & sponsorship program were provided with 'Education Kits' and 'Nutritious Food' (Immunity Boosters). 5 children of AIRTC were provided with five kits each:

The Five Kits contained the following items:

- The **Education Kit** contained the following items:
 - o Pencil, eraser, drawing board, magnetic letters, color tape, glitter sheets, origami sheets, glaze sheets, ice-cream sticks, cotton rolls, chart papers, Fevicol and A4 color sheets.
- The Nutritious Food / Immunity Boosters Kit contained the following items:
 - Chickpeas, chocos, porridge, mix pulses, soya chunks, dry flakes, roasted nuts, jaggery, biscuits and oats.
- The **Personal Hygiene Kit** contained the following items:
 - O Hair oil, Dettol soap, tooth brush, toothpaste, shoes, socks, handkerchief, masks and water bottle
- The **Therapy Kit** contained the following items:
 - O Colorful light balls, smiley balls, squeezing balls, wooden hammer game, wooden sewing, puzzles, aiming game, cube, beads, clay, respirometer and weight cuffs.
- The **Essential Food Item / Ration** contained the following items:
 - Rice, sugar, salt, oil, soap, pulses, wheat flour, turmeric and face mask.



ASRA INTERVENTION, RECREATION AND THERAPY CENTRE (AIRTC) FOR CHILDREN WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

During the period from April 2020 to March 2021, the AIRTC remained physically shut due to lockdown, 34 children with special needs availed special education classes via 3127 video / voice calling sessions.

During the quarter under report, the children enrolled in AIRTC attended special education sessions. Their parents were provided with counselling.

The children enrolled in AIRTC have different types of disabilities, predominantly intellectual disabilities associated with physical impairments. Some children also have speech & hearing impairments for whom speech therapy is provided by ASRA. Special Education and Therapy Sessions of AIRTC children

The strength of AIRTC is four special educators and one music teacher. The AIRTC children were divided amongst four special educators and one music teacher on the basis of their IQ and disability.

- One to one online and offline academic sessions designed according to Individual needs are being provided by the Special Educators to AIRTC children from Monday to Friday from 10.00 am till 3.30 pm. Parents are also guided during the sessions.
- Worksheets of academics i.e. Hindi, English, Maths and Art & Craft are prepared by the Special Educators
 and then forwarded to the parents. These worksheets are designed on the basis of children's IQ level and
 disability.
- Therapy plans for each AIRTC student is made according to the need and disability of the child.

- During the first wave of COVID-19 pandemic i.e. from April 2020 to March 2021, ASRA had provided 819 online music and dance classes to 34 children.




CELEBRATIONS

Success Stories

My name is Premchand. I am 30 years old and live in Indira Camp-II community. In my family, there are two brothers and my mother and I both are physically challenged. I am disabled by birth.

I have been associated with ASRA since last 25 years. I am physically challenged and therefore, I cannot do any work. It is very difficult to meet family expenses. I face many difficulties. I met ASRA teacher in community and through her I came to know ASRA. ASRA helped me in procuring facilities like disability certificate, Railway Concession Certificate, Bus Pass, SDM card and most importantly pension.

During Cornora period, everything was closed. There was no work for family. It was a very tough time and with the kind help of ASRA, I received

ration which gave us big relief. I am very thankful to ASRA for the same. Even now, my family's economic condition is full of challenges. I express the gratitude to ASRA for help.



My name is Lalita and I am 24 years old. I live in Indira Camp-II slum community. I am associated with ASRA since last 14 years. In my family, me and my husband, both are handicapped. We have a daughter. My husband is engaged in cutting and tailoring work because of which we can earn our bread. I am disabled since birth and have been facing many-many difficulties since childhood. In the year 2008, I met ASRA volunteers and they gave me very useful information about the Government facilities. I could get Disability certificate, Railway Concession Certificate, Bus Pass, SDM card, Railway E-card and disability pension. Because of Pension, my family got big financial

support. Due to Cornora, we faced lot of difficulties. I requested ASRA to help me. ASRA gave me Ration for which I am very grateful

UPDATE ON ONGOING PROGRAMS

COMMUNITY BASED REHABILITATION (CBR)

During the first wave of COVID-19 pandemic, i.e. from April 2020 to March 2021, ASRA had provided information regarding COVID-19 disease and its symptoms and preventions to PwD beneficiaries through 4967 Video/Voice calls.

ASRA CBR team used the means of telecommunication as well as paid door to door visits to stay connected with its beneficiaries in the communities. The CBR staff made hundreds of calls every day to keep themselves abreast about the wellbeing, medical condition and other needs of the families. The team continued to provide information about the initiatives taken / special schemes provided by the Central and State Governments for their welfare. Counselling was also provided about the safety and preventive measures around COVID—19 and orientation was done on COVID—19 symptoms, spread and its precautions.

a. Individual & Group counseling:

- ASRA CBR Team constantly provided information to PwDs / CwDs about the basic steps for the prevention of COVID-19 as per the guidelines given by WHO and Ministry of Health, Government of India.
- Beneficiaries and their families were told about the Do's and Don'ts related to Covid 19.
- ASRA CBR Team always tried to participate in the implementation of Government Initiatives by
 - a. Informing beneficiaries telephonically about the arrival of food.
 - b. Helped in distribution of food to people at 'Rahat Camp' by Government.
 - c. Helped create awareness to maintain Social Distancing during Food or Ration Distribution by Government Organizations.
- Procedural guidance was provided to apply for 'Online Temporary Ration Card' by the Government.

During the quarter under report 1314 beneficiaries were given information about COVID-19 disease and its Symptoms and preventions provided with online sessions as follows:



- d. **CBR Sponsorship Program:** 207 Children with Disabilities (CwDs) have been sponsored under this program till date. 13 children with disabilities enrolled themselves in AIRTC Special School and they are also receiving physiotherapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy etc. along with Special Education.
- e. **CBR Vocational Training:** During the previous year i.e. April 2020 to March 2021, total 133 students attended online vocational training classes.

ASRA is running Inclusive Vocational Training / Skill Development Centres in Tailoring, Beauty Culture, Computer Courses and Mobile Repairing Courses in adopted slum communities. The training has empowered girls/ women and young boys to earn their livelihood. Those who have completed their training are now able to supplement their family income by taking jobs from their community members. Teachers are conducting online classes of Tailoring, Beauty Culture & Mobile repairing via telephones, Video calls and WhatsApp groups.

MEDICAL INTERVENTION & THERAPEUTIC SERVICES AT ASRA HEAD OFFICE AND CBR

During the previous year i.e. April 2020 to March 2021, total 6016 sessions were provided digitally to 242 OPD patients and 34 children under AIRTC and total 6388 sessions to 278 PwDs from ASRA's adopted communities.


Initially, through online conferencing, all the therapists discussed a holistic approach to be followed with the patients. Patients have been divided amongst the Therapists according to the disabilities and diagnosis. Patients are guided about the exercises they can do by themselves at home. Therapists are telephonically resolving doubts of OPD patients regarding their exercise program. Therapy plans are made according to the need and disability of the children.

Videos and pictorials prepared by the therapists are sent to parents. Follow-up is done regularly with the parents. Exercises are being taught to patients / parents of children who don't have smart phones via phone call.

Following are details of patients and therapy sessions during the quarter under report:

a. ASRA Head Office and AIRTC

ASRA HANDICRAFT EMPORIUM

During the previous year i.e. April 2020 to March 2021, 7292 masks have been stitched by ARTC and CBR Tailoring staff. 355 orders were booked and 342 orders were completed by ASRA Emporium staff during last year.

ASRA Handicraft Emporium has been functional since April 2010. The Emporium is taking orders of stitching / alteration work and repairing of clothes etc. Due to lockdown, order work and stitching of mask was done by tailoring staff from home.

• Total 1028 masks have been stitched by ARTC and CBR Tailoring staff during the quarter under report. These masks are being distributed free of cost to the PwD beneficiaries and children of education, sponsorship and AIRTC programs. Masks are also being sold out to the interested customers.

SEED LOAN

The purpose of this program is to promote financial independence and help disabled persons living in slums to earn their livelihood and improve their quality of life. Seed Loan is given exclusively to the disabled beneficiaries of ASRA who are needy and want to be self-reliant. With the help of Seed Loan, they either purchase additional material for their respective enterprise or start a new enterprise which helps them to increase their monthly income. The total number of beneficiaries under Seed Loan program is 124.

NEW INITIATIVES

CBR Activities in NOIDA to replicate the existing CBR model

The CBR model is being applied to this new initiative.

During the quarter under report, after collecting basic profiles of Noida Sec-08 slums community & Hoshiyarpur Village CBR Team conducted Baseline Survey and Medical Assessment at both places. Total 56 PwDs/CwDs were identified in Noida Sec-08 and 37 PwDs/CwDs were identified in Hoshiyarpur Village during the baseline survey.

ASRA CBR team conducted Needs Assessments Survey in Hoshiyarpur Village and prepared the list of Students for computer course. A new Computer Centre has been started on 3rd December 2021 at Hoshiyarpur Village, Ms. Pooja Sharma has joined as Computer Teacher at Noida Hoshiyarpur Centre.

Presently, Total 06 Students (including 02 PwD Student) are taking classes from ASRA Computer center.

The mobile repairing unit which was wound up from CBR was reestablished in ARTC which also offered mobile repairing service to outside clients.

The Vaccination of PwDs through ASRA

ASRA initiated a vaccination drive to provide a safety shield to Persons with Disabilities living in its adopted community since they were trapped into a situation of helplessness due to lack of awareness and attention. Many of the community members were struggling for survival and mental health. A focused campaign was planned to provide support to the PwDs to combat with the crisis of Covid-19 pandemic with awareness, counseling followed by vaccination. The PwDs covered under the vaccination drive have also been supported with Ration, Health and Hygiene Kits, Immunity boosters etc.

During the quarter under report 46 PwDs spread across 10 communities were vaccinated. The ASRA vaccination drive will continue.
